

Launched independently in 2011 by the Plymouth Antiquarian Society, the Burial Hill series is now a collaborative program with the Pilgrim Society & Pilgrim Hall Museum.

The Plymouth Antiquarian Society preserves local history after the Pilgrim era, with historic collections including the 1809 Hedge House, the 1749 Spooner House, and the 1677 Harlow House. Established in 1919, the Antiquarian Society offers a diverse range of tours, special events, and programs. Membership is open to all who share a passion for local history.

Pilgrim Hall Museum is the oldest continuously operating museum in the country with an unmatched collection of colonial artifacts and documents that reveal the lives of Plymouth's early residents, both English and Wampanoag. Open 7 days a week year-round (except January), Pilgrim Hall Museum features changing exhibitions, lectures, tours and programs.
